Assistant City Manager Moton accepts Greenville, North Carolina post

FEBRUARY 10, 2006: University City Assistant City Manager Thomas M. Moton, Jr. today announced his acceptance of the position of Assistant City Manager of Greenville, North Carolina. Moton leaves U. City March 2 after serving in the position since October 2002.



“It’s always exciting and rewarding to see the professionals I’ve worked with continue to develop and advance in city management,” said U. City Manager Frank Ollendorff. “Thomas Moton has served U. City well. He is a true professional and has been a great asset in a number of projects ranging from information technology, municipal court, public information, to development of the Fire Station expansion. His expertise in business development, City Hall operations and throughout the community will be felt for years to come. He will be hard to replace.”

Prior to joining University City, Moton served as assistant dean of Navarro College District in Waxahachie, Texas, as assistant city manager of Corsicana, Texas, and Sr. Human Resource Trainer of Dallas County Juvenile Department, Dallas, Texas.

In response to this career opportunity, Moton said, “Some of my proudest professional moments have come from working with the U. City business community, citizens, mayor and city council, management team and staff. Mr. Ollendorff’s compassion for helping citizens address service needs, expertise at building consensus, and guiding the management team are skills I hope to take with me. However, to be chosen for the Greenville position from a nationwide field of 176 candidates is an honor. It speaks to the caliber of development opportunities U. City affords its employees. Moton begins his new position March 13. He will oversee Public Information, Financial Services, Information Technology, Human Resources, and Planning and Community Development.
