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The City's Storm Water Management Program (SMP) is a comprehensive, three-phased initiative to alleviate various storm water concerns in the community. Starting with problem identification city-wide and proceeding through master planning and final design and construction of projects over a period of several years, the three phases of the SMP are:

Phase I: Needs Assessment

Phase II: Master Plan

Phase III: Projects

What will Phase I of the SMP accomplish and how long will it take?

The primary goals of the Storm Water Needs Assessment (Phase I) are to:

- Identify potential storm water infrastructure problems located in the City;
- Collect and assimilate the data necessary to confirm that the problems are real; and
- Compile a prioritized list of the infrastructure problems identified.

Phase I began in early 2015. The process is anticipated to be complete in November 2015.

What will Phase II of the SMP accomplish and how long will it take?

The primary goals of the Storm Water Master Plan (Phase II) are to:

- Develop conceptual solutions and cost estimates for a number (to be determined) of prioritized problems;
- Update project evaluations of each problem and re-prioritize based on conceptual designs and public input; and
- Prepare a Storm Water Master Plan report to serve as a roadmap for Phase III and beyond.

The Phase II schedule is dependent on the results of Phase I. Currently, it is anticipated to take six to nine months, starting in 2016.

What will Phase III of the SMP accomplish and how long will it take?

The primary goal of Storm Water Projects (Phase III) is to:

 Design and construct improvements from the Storm Water Master Plan based on the prioritized list and as funding remains available.

The Phase III schedule is dependent on a number of factors, such as: public buy-in, regulatory reviews, easement acquisitions (if applicable), and funding. Currently, it is anticipated to begin in 2016-2017 and continue over several years.
