Amendment of By-Laws/Election of Officers: In the absence of a slate of officers for 2018, the Executive Committee recommended amendment of the by-laws to allow officers to succeed themselves. After discussion, a motion was made by Melcine Henderson, seconded by Marian Reed, to postpone indefinitely the election of officers. The motion carried.

Calendar photos forwarded to the Director of Finance and final choices will be made by the City this year. Once again, Arts & Letters commissioner Lawanda Hinton and her family won the Recreation Division's 2nd Annual Trunk or Treat award.

Council Liaison Report: Mr. Smotherson reported a new City Manager may be chosen by the end of December. An RFP for demolition of building and sculptures on City property at Olive and Midland is being planned. Commissioners whose terms are expiring and are willing to serve another term will be re-appointed.

- Starlight Concerts The committee is working on final artists' info.
