Councilmember Clay moved to approve the Consent Agenda, it was seconded by Councilmember McMahon.

Councilmember Clay stated given the recent issues with a couple of different trucks, he asked if there was need for more than one truck?

Mr. Rose stated that one vehicle is waiting on an engine, and there are other vehicles that go down intermittently. Currently we are using parts from the truck that is waiting on the engine to repair the other vehicles. That will only work for so long, this purchase will move us back towards normal operations. Until the supply chain issue is addressed we will not be back to completely normal operations. The new truck will make a significant improvement in our operations.

Councilmember Clay that he is supportive of this purchase, and asked will we need another new truck?

Mr. Rose stated a couple of new trucks are scheduled in the capital improvement program next fiscal year, if we challenges arise, he may ask Council to advance the purchase of one of the trucks to this fiscal year. The funding is currently coming from the solid waste budget; Council recently provided a million-dollar load to the fund, which has its own challenges. We certainly do not want to get into a position of not being able to collect solid waste or recycle materials. We are not at the point.

Voice vote on Councilmember Clays' motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Rose stated this agenda item asks the Council to consider remanding the Avenir Chapter 353 request to the Plan Commission. This recommended action will enable staff to brief the commission and provide them with a recommendation on how to proceed.

Councilmember Hales asked Mr. Rose to expand upon why he asking to remand this item.

Mr. Rose stated in review of the actions take by the Plan Commission when this was initially considered, staff did not provide a briefing that would reflect the economic the pros and cons of the Chapter 353. Therefore, the commission took an action without hearing staff's perspective on the matter. He is recommending the item be remanded so that the Plan Commission which would allow them to receive a briefing from staff that will highlight the economic impact of the project and provide staff's' professional opinion regarding the approval or denial.

Councilmember Clay made a motion to remand the Chapter 353 to the Plan Commission, it was seconded by Councilmember McMahon, the motion carried unanimously.

With regard to K. CITY MANAGER'S REPORT (vote required)

1. Avenir - Chapter 353 Referral to the Plan Commission

Basically, I would just point out point out that tax abatement is intended to allow development projects that *could not otherwise happen* without tax abatement—and the developer would have to make a strong case based on insufficient projected rental receipts (262 units with monthly rents from \$1600-\$3600 per unit = \$419,200/month at the absolute minimum!) or enormous construction and/or finance costs (which seems unlikely-- obviously the developer is already moving ahead with his plans within the fenced area.)

A tax abatement totaling \$3.45 million simply means that till 2030 OUR taxes will remain high or may have to be increased to provide police, fire, EMS, school, library, etc. services to 262 new units. Based on the population of University City, the proposed tax abatement works out to a \$100 gift to Charles Deutsch & Company from every citizen.

The developer should make his case clearly with financial projections and with review by a knowledgeable disinterested party if he is to be accorded this. The figures should confirm that the Avenir project *could not otherwise happen* without the requested tax abatement. Otherwise I feel that asking U-City residents to be asked to shoulder HIS tax burden, or else give up social services due to the shortfall just to increase his profits, is inappropriate.

Tax Abatement under Chapter 353 or Chapter 100 or any other name is the SAME TAX ABATEMENT THAT WAS ALREADY VOTED DOWN BY THE PLAN COMMISSION. What possible justification is there for reconsideration of the same bill?
