1. Call to Order at 6:30PM by Commissioner Jane Schaefer.

3. Approval of Agenda.

Motion By Commissioner Craig Hughes to approve the agenda and motion 2nd by Commissioner Jane Schaefer. Motion approved by a unanimous voice vote of the commission.

4. Approval of minutes of 2/8/2023, 3/8/2023 and 3/14/2023. There was an error on the petitioner's first name that needed to be corrected. Should be Chana, not China. With this correction made, the minutes were approved. 2-8-2023- motion to approve the minutes by Mr. Tiers and motion 2nd by Mr. Zelenovich, 3-8-2023, motion to approve the minutes by Hughes and motion 2nd by Mr. Tiers, 3-14-2023, motion to approve the minutes by Ms. Schaefer, motion 2nd by Mr. Tiers.

5. Agenda Items:

Ms. Peggy Holly, Chair of Plan Commission, updated the Traffic Commission on the Comprehensive Plan update with the aid of a power point presentation-attached. Ms. Holly explained that the comprehensive plan started on 2005 and the City staff is working extensively for one and half year in order to finalize this strategic plan on 2024. Information on the Comprehensive Plan development is in WeMakeUCity.com. Goals include reserving great places and stable affordable housing – stability includes housing that does not flood, creating new spaces for parks and recreation facilities on the flood prone areas, limit the development on this area providing elevations of the buildings and adding stormwater retention features. The important key on the process is improving collaboration through responsive governance and strategic partnerships to receive community's feedback and vision. Approximately 500 individuals have participated so far in the first round of public engagement, which is underway now (workshops, online, paper surveys, pop-up events). The city is going back to community on late July 2023, providing more specifics and gather residents' feedback. The plan is to present the draft comprehensive plan in front of Planning and Zoning Commission in August and the final plan to City Council in October. The plan will build on the visioning work done in the Community



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Vision 2040 Roadmap. Traffic Commission can provide recommendations analyzing the streets, considering traffic safety issues, installing sidewalks on the areas that do not have one, installing bike path, traffic calming, crosswalks, providing public transportation and parking areas along with this new development. The commission discussed the buy out properties, demographic population and how these would affect the traffic. The City will collaborate with MoDOT and St. Louis County to plan together toward Comprehensive plan. Planning and zoning Commission will meet with different commissions to obtain their input to Comprehensive Plan development. Traffic Commission suggests having a special session on July and address traffic issues relating to the future planning.

The Preserve at Canton. Mr. Girdler provided info for this new proposed development of eleven acres. The proposed Development includes around one hundred town homes-units, with 2 and 3 bedrooms. Since is not generating one hundred new trips at pick hour, a traffic study is not needed. The intention is that the street to be installed per City pavement specs. and be maintained by the City. The conceptual plans show detention area to mitigate the stormwater.

6. Council Liaison Report:

- Mr. Fuller stated that the Ward 2 Council members have appointments to fill in traffic commission.
- On March 8 Council Meeting there was a presentation by MSD related to the Clear water project. MSD provided a map of proposed projects on the City. The traffic commissioner will be provided with this information. On May 11,2023, University City will go under new 911 system police Dept.
- On June 1st, there will be a new announcement on the new retail facility at Market at Olive.
- On the previous meeting, Commission approved the request to restrict parking on South side of Forsyth, 7000 and 7100 Blocks. Based on City's code and a site visit, there are no single family residential, there are multifamily buildings on the south side of Forsyth. Based on the last Council meeting, council member Hale, he entered that the bill that was introduced, allows 7000 and 7100 Blocks to participate on the residential parking permit program. The commission will need to revisit the situation again, review the program and recommend if the bill needs to be amended, revising the program.

7. Miscellaneous Business:

- Mr. Hughes stated that on March 8, 2023, the commission approved the request to allow the school district to close the eastbound lane of Balson Ave. from Hanley Rd. to Jackson Ave. There is an issue with this request. Darin Girdler explained that the County didn't allow to close the Balson with left turning on Hanley. Otherwise, they would need to block off the turn lane at southbound each half hour period, being a county road and causing traffic issues. Mr. Mullingan stated there is a code provision from 2:15pm-3:00pm on school days at Jackson Ave. 36 feet south of Shaftesbury Ave.
- **8.** Adjournment. No further business appearing. Commissioner Hughes made a motion to adjourn, motion was 2nd by Commissioner Tiers.



Requesting an overall parking plan for 1) Taco Buddha's customers (primary) but also including Cursed Bikes and Coffee's customers at the frontage of 7401/7405 Pershing AND 2) restricted customer parking (via Neighborhood parking permits) for those businesses on West Point Court and Kingsbury Blvd.

- 1. Curbside Pickup Lane Plan at the frontage of 7401/7405 Pershing Ave.
 - Specifically, a plan that allows for no parking on the Pershing Ave frontage of at 7401 and 7405 during business hours so that customer's cars can quickly pick up scheduled, pre-purchased items and leave the area without having to park in other areas within the block such as West Point Ct and Kingsbury Blvd.
 - Without signs on the public side of the sidewalk in front of 7401 and 7405 Pershing Ave (Cursed Bikes/Taco Buddha) during operational hours, that designate the area to be a Curbside pickup lane/no parking during operational hours, 1) Curbside operations will not be possible and 2) approximately 80-140 cars a day will park around the area just to pick up purchased goods and leave within a short period of time.

- Remove the "No Parking" signs between the alley west of 7405 Pershing Ave and West Point Court

> Walking along Jackson there is a crosswalk to get over to the park on the corner of Cornell. The crosswalk there has a sign that says to stop for pedestrians, but I witness on a daily basis cars not obeying this sign. They speed past with pedestrians extremely close. More than once I have had to stop a kid riding a bike or scooter from almost getting hit by a car.



Numerous non-residents park on the south side of Forsyth during the week. Frequently, nonresident drivers park on our block and walk to Washington University in order to avoid the oncampus parking fees.

Since non-resident cars are consistently parked along the south side of Forsyth, it is virtually impossible for residents to have a parking spot available for ourselves or for our guests and service workers in front of our homes. The University City code sited above and all of the other blocks adjacent to the western border of the Danforth Campus have already completed the process of requesting resident only parking. This petition will bring the south side of Forsyth in line with all of the adjacent blocks to WashU.

The non-resident parking problems on the south side of Forsyth should also be corrected since such problems require a lot of time, expense and effort on the part of University City. The nonresidents parking on the south side frequently ignore "no parking" notices for city leaf collection, thereby resulting in the University City Public Works Department having to post repeated notices and make several visits to our blocks to attempt to vacuum up the leaves, ultimately having to give up its attempts due to the cars continually parked on the street.

SPECIFIC AREA REQUESTED TO BE RESTRICTED:

South side of Forsyth Blvd. from 7008 Forsyth going west until the 2 hour only parking zone in front of 7148. Resident Only Parking.

REQUESTED RESTRICTED TIME PERIOD (SHALL NOT EXCEED 12 HOURS DAILY): From 9:00 AM - 5:00 PM on Monday - Friday. (WashU currently allows free parking on campus on weekends therefore non residents would not have a reason to park on Forsyth.)

Existing Conditions:

Please see attached sketch (red line marked sections are current residential parking permit zones and yellow line shows the requested zone).

Request:

To designate the south side of Forsyth Blvd in the 7000 and 7100 blocks as a residential permit parking area from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on weekdays, Monday through Friday.

There were previous requests for allowing inclusion in the current 7100 block Forsyth Blvd. residential parking permit system of employees of Chabad House (4 ea.) at 7018 Forsyth Blvd. and changing the parking restrictions to allow open parking on Fridays after 5 p.m. The Commission considered this request at its October 2021 meeting and moved to recommend approval of both requests subject to petition-process required rate of approval (75%) by the property owners.

Conclusion/Recommendation:

The request is in accordance with the applicable University City Traffic Code (Section 355.030) as the street is within two (2) blocks of Washington University and the problems caused by non-resident parking on the block are chronic and well documented.

A petition is recommended to be initiated by the requestor to encompass the entire adjacent private property parcels of real estate on the south side of the 7000 and 7100 blocks of Forsyth Blvd. and be signed by at least one (1) owner of record for each of the parcels.

The discussion of this item is intended to produce a recommendation and vote from the Traffic Commission to consider allowing the requestor to begin the petition process for their request as outlined above.

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
