2) Tennis Court Usage

- James Hopkins
 - First come first serve
 - Four or five professional holds lessons
 - Will not allow anyone to use the court, they hold
 - Someone is going to hurt
 - Tennis groups keep court for two or more hours
 - Wants to sell permits to use the courts
 - Yearly – charge \$30
 - Daily - charge \$5-\$10
 - Grant money from Professional Tennis Association holds tournaments taking up the tennis courts for the whole day
 - Kaufman Park - Pickle Ball groups using more then the two assigned courts
 - Signs are not affective.
 - Concerned about confronting players holding courts

- 1) August 15th, 2023 minutes, Patrick Fox stated that he had spoken to Darin Girdler and agreed to accept the entered statement. Sue stated she didn't state to get rid of the pool contract only that it should be re-evaluated because she wasn't impressed with them. 1st motion and 2nd motion, and approved with Sue Schmalz's change
- 2) September 19 minutes are Pending

Agenda Item E: CITIZEN PARTICIPATION

Kevin Taylor: current park department by-laws 3.9 adopted 4/21/2015; are any of the current park commission members familiar with these by-laws? Are the by-laws kept at the meetings? Advising that the by-laws be present at the meetings. A couple months ago, a commission member declined to let him talk at the Citizen Participation which is against this by-law. Mr. Taylor wants this page included in the minutes. If there has been a revision, then it needs to be at the meeting. Mr. Taylor has been told the by-laws are on the website but he states they are not. Sue Schmalz stated she believed the by-laws had been updated. Mr. Taylor submitted a document for the record.

Agenda Item F: DEPARTMENT REPORT

Darin Girdler,

- found a copy of the Clayton agreement but it isn't signed, **see if we can find a signed**
- The Library started the Story Walk in Heman Park. There was vandalism hopefully because where the signs were placed toward the back, not traveled heavily, area. They have put new signs toward the road area of Heman Park.

- Ruth Park Woods: was able to hike all the way through, trees have been removed, looks good and people were using it
- Ruth Park Golf Course: the memorial bench is on the ground, likes the bench on the ground safely without legs, legs? Drinking fountain still not working, put out an Igloo cooler instead?
- Kaufmann: lots of pickle ball play, back boards – take down or fix, ripped the steps out; should be replaced north side of tennis courts? James Wilke mentions there is no ADA path from the upper level to the lower level.
- Flynn Park: a lot of people are not happy with all the pickle ball lines, lesson happening on courts
 - James Wilke: doesn't recall discussing putting pickle ball lines at Flynn Park the only park discussed for pickle ball lines was Kaufmann.
 - Sue Schmalz: Why are the lines at Flynn Park so light verses the bright lines at Kaufmann?
 - Darin Girdler: two different sub-contractors
- Heman Park: pile of storm brush concerned about fire, Darin Girdler stated the contractor has been selected and the contract just needs to be signed. Wants some of the ground up wood chips to make it to the dog park.
- Lights: out working with Todd to find out why some are working some are not, some flash but don't stay on
- Is looking forward to the Parks Department getting caught up so both sides of the dog park can look the same
- Third Ward Revitalization Task Force: using the signs to notify residents to fill out a survey for the third ward. Was wondering what the opportunity would be to have yard signs placed at the entrances to the parks so the third ward residents would have quantity and quality to work with.
 - Female stated that someone from the commission should be a part of the Third Ward Revitalization Task Force
 - James Wilke asked if Chris had been sworn in yet. He needs to get that done.
 - Female asking how many parks each person has, she has three, the male speaking about the dog park only have the dog park, another female stated she only has one. 36:04
 - James Wilke wants a list of all correctly named parks so it can be emailed out so everyone can select parks they want to visit and report on.

James Wilke asked about the Jack Buck field Mr. Taylor spoke on earlier. Is it being worked on?

- FEMA work is being done, verified by Darin Girdler
- Millar Park: What is the timeline
- Darin Girdler: council approved the construction part, \$575,000 is the grant amount, in November we should know if we get the grant or not. The high school baseball team will be using the Millar Park field with some minor adjustments. We have a sports company installing a new pitchers mount to regulations. The Capital part would begin immediately after the 2024 season (March - May) and be brand new in the spring 2025.
- Is the splash pad at Heman Park still in the works? Darin Girdler stated yes, it is being put together to stay within budget for the features and amenities.

for Ucity kids or all kids? Red Bird Rookies is run by University City and is only available to Ucity kids. Lights, fields, indoor facilities: the commission has to start thinking now about the repercussions of the previous decisions.

- Sue; when did the Sports Association start paying? Lynda: 2004-2005
- Darin: last 3-4 pages, met with program last week,
- James: use outdoor facilities for that season,
- Lynda: they start using last year, then wanted to do a cooperative agreement with the city so use the lights and fields for free. The agreement was given to the city attorney last year but has never been given back. James asked if they are paying now, Lynda stated yes, playing since August. They use the entire Olive Blvd. side. Affiliate organizations are given a reduced rate but are scheduled just as any other organization.
- James: doesn't believe the commission or city would benefit from allowing this for-profit organization to use the fields/lights for free, we should keep charging them
- Female: wants to make a motion for the agreement not to be signed, Male stated he suggest not to do anything, female is concerned about it being passed through the council like the pickle ball lines.
- Lynda asked if Darin would reach out to the organization, he stated yes

2) Management Policies

- James Wilke: would like the managers of the parks department to go through the documents and recommend any missing areas that need to be included in the policies. What are the other things that happen? Wants to have the current charges/fees, make it more overall where it doesn't have to be changed all the time. Doesn't expect the updated information immediately. Happy they have something to start with. Maybe in a few months get a rough start draft. Wants to
 - Wants the original number kept, how the policy started/effects, what needs to be changed and why, any documentation that supports the policy verbiage.
- Lynda Euell-Taylor: states for example the Special Events Policy, there is a new one, it's not in here. Thinks the current staff to look over the policies. Wants to have her staff take a couple a week and review and update. What needs to go to the city council, commission, or just staff.
- Field rentals, different insurance requirements; student rates?
- Is the goal to make a whole new document?
- James Wilke: yes, these are just a foundation

"So I would like to ask Darin to inquire for series for more information on what led up to that decision, and who did, who decided to close it and when they decided to close it because they did not reach out to the Parks Director and it also has a really great policy in here about discipline within
