Mr. Girdler stated he received the construction schedule for Centennial Commons and the other facilities impacted by the flood on Friday, and after staff has had an opportunity to review the perimeters it will be forwarded to Mr. Rose for inclusion in his weekly report to Council. He stated staff's ability to bring programs back online will be predicated on the construction schedule, so the hope is that it will be accelerated.

Before renovating the gym; which will be the most complex renovation, a trench drain or removal of the stoops outside of the emergency exit doors will need to be reconstructed to pitch away from the building to make sure any surface water is evacuated.

All of the roofs have been examined, and although the gym's roof is 18 years old, it is still in pretty good shape. Funds for exterior improvements to the facility will be requested in the next year's budget.

Mr. Girdler thanked Lynda Euell-Taylor and the staff at Centennial Commons for their efforts to help him develop this plan.

Mr. Rose stated while Centennial Commons is partially online, with the exercise area, the walking track, and the pool. This is a continuation of their efforts to make it fully operational. Staff has been coordinating their efforts with FEMA, which requires very specific and detailed bidding documents. And as a result, Council authorized staff to enter into a contract with NAVIGATE. Mr. Girdler and his staff have been working with NAVIGATE and FEMA to ensure that any funds expended will be reimbursed. He then asked Mr. Girdler if he could provide an estimated time for when the bidding would commence? Mr. Girdler stated it is scheduled to start next month.

Councilmember Smotherson posed the following questions to Mr. Girdler:

Q. Does U City have Splash Pads at any of its other locations?

A. Yes, Fogerty Park.

Q. Will you need a membership to access the Splash Pad at Heman?

A. Yes.

Q. Was there anything in your discussions to bring back summer or winter camps, the 50+ basketball league, and the weekly Bridge Club held on Thursdays at Centennial Commons?

A. Although there have not been any specific discussions, they can be included in the bi-weekly planning meetings conducted with his staff, the recreation center, and Centennial Commons.

Q. What will the fitness programs being resumed in September consist of?

A. While I don't have any specific details, it will be a general fitness program.

Q. (Mr. Rose): Are you referring to classes like aerobics that were conducted by third-party contractors?

A. Yes.

Mr. Rose stated September will consist of overall fitness programs that are not conducted by City staff. So, before these facilities come back online a robust marketing campaign will be conducted to ensure organizations that have used them in the past will be notified about their reopening.

Councilmember Hales stated this is all very welcoming news and his hope is that the progress with Centennial Commons moves as quickly as possible. One of the questions posed by Council was related to membership at these facilities post-COVID and the flood, and whether they will have enough members to support all of these plans. So perhaps, a similar incentive like the early-bird membership could be offered at Centennial Commons.

Councilmember Klein echoed Councilmember Hales' enthusiasm and thinks the community is going to be excited as well. She reiterated the need for summer programs for school-aged children and the importance of making sure that their marketing campaign reaches everyone.

Mr. Girdler stated the intent is to not only follow their past marketing practices but to look at ways they can be enhanced.

Mayor Crow asked if there was an update on the perpetual issue of hiring lifeguards? Mr. Girdler stated they will be using the same company for the entire season this year, so staff should not be an issue.

Mayor Crow acknowledged Mr. Wilke's presence and thanked him for his service on the City's Park Commission.

Mr. Rose stated if Council is amenable, the intent is to prepare a letter in support of this project for the Mayor's signature that will be forwarded to the State.

2. 





Zoning Code Text Proposed to be Amended

Section 400.1260, Fence Materials, consists of subsections A and B, as outlined below. The proposed amendment is in **bold** red type.

Division 7, Fence Regulations

Section 400.1260 Fence Materials.

- A. Except as otherwise provided for in Subsection (B) of this Section, fence material shall be that which is designed and intended for use in fence installations, including decorative masonry (e.g., brick, stone, or textured and pigmented concrete). All fences shall be maintained in a structurally sound condition and otherwise in a neat and clean appearance.
- B. Barbed or razor wire **or tarps or tarp-like material** shall not constitute any part of a fence in any residential or "PA" zoning district. In all other districts, barbed or razor wire may be attached to the fence, above six (6) feet.

Staff Analysis




Figure 1. Location of the four (4) parcels to be consolidated.

It is the City's intention with this Text Amendment to strengthen the fence regulations by prohibiting a tarp or similar type material to be used as fence material, either as a fence itself or incorporated into an existing fence, such as a chain link fence. See Figure 1 for an example of the type of material the amendment seeks to prohibit.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ZONING CODE SECTION 400.1260 OF THE UNIVERSITY CITY MUNICIPAL CODE, RELATING TO FENCE MATERIALS, BY ADDING PROVISIONS PROHIBITING TARP FENCES IN RESIDENTIAL AND PUBLIC ACTIVITY ("PA") ZONING DISTRICTS.

WHEREAS, Chapter 400 (Zoning Code) of the University City Municipal Code divides the City of University City, Missouri (City) into several zoning districts and establishes standards therein to which land, buildings, structures and their uses must conform; and

WHEREAS, in a meeting held on December 6, 2023, the City Plan Commission examined a Zoning Code text amendment to Section 400.1260 by adding provisions prohibiting tarp fences in residential and public activity ("PA") zoning districts; and

WHEREAS, due notice of a public hearing to be held by the City Council in the City Council Chambers at City Hall at 6:30 p.m. on January 22, 2024, was duly published on January 7, 2024 in the St. Louis Countian, a newspaper of general circulation within the City; and

WHEREAS, the public hearing was held at the time and place specified in said notice, and all suggestions or objections concerning the text amendment to the Zoning Code of the City were duly heard and considered by the City Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF UNIVERSITY CITY, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Zoning Code Section 400.1260 of the University City Municipal Code, relating to fence materials, is hereby amended by adding provisions prohibiting tarp fences in residential and public activity ("PA") zoning districts, so that said Section, as so amended, shall read as follows:

Section 400.1260. Fence Materials.

- A. Except as otherwise provided for in Subsection (B) of this Section, fence material shall be that which is designed and intended for use in fence installations, including decorative masonry (e.g., brick, stone, or textured and pigmented concrete). All fences shall be maintained in a structurally sound condition and otherwise in a neat and clean appearance.
- B. Barbed or razor wire, or tarp or similar material, shall not constitute any part of a fence in any residential or "PA" zoning district. In all other districts, barbed or razor wire may be attached to the fence, above six (6) feet.

<u>Section 2.</u> This ordinance shall not be construed so as to relieve any person, firm or corporation from any penalty incurred by the violation of Section 400.1260 of the University City Municipal Code, nor bar the prosecution of any such violation.

<u>Section 3.</u> Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to the penalties provided in Section 400.2570 of the University City Municipal Code.

<u>Section 4.</u> This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage as provided by law.

Existing Property and Applicant Request

The subject property currently consists of four (4) properties:

- 1. 6757 Olive Boulevard (0.77 acres);
- 2. 6767 Olive Boulevard (0.21 acres);
- 3. 6771 Olive Boulevard (0.11 acres); and
- 4. 6773 Olive Boulevard (0.37 acres).

The Applicant has requested the Consolidation Plat together with a Conditional Use Permit for the Urban Sprouts Child Development Center (The Center), also on the agenda, CUP 23-08. The Center is located at 6757 Olive Boulevard, the most eastern of these four (4) parcels. The Center is proposing to expand to encompass the three lots immediately to the east (6767, 6771 and 6773 Olive Boulevard) to Ferguson Avenue. The new lot would be 1.46 acres in size. 
