Call to Order: The meeting began at 9:05 a.m. with a quorem

Public Comments: Joe Edwards shared details on the 52 Arnual Blueberry Hill Dart Tournament along with the Bubble Hockey Tournament. Mr. Edwards also provided an update about Jenifer Lewis and her recent addition to the Walk of Fame.

Audrey Jones announced the winning mannequals are showcased in the University City Public Library.

Approval of the Minutes: Renau Bozart, made a motion to approve the LSBD Board Meeting Minutes on July 9, 20.4 and August 23, 2024. Dan Wald seconded the motion. Without further discussion, the meeting minutes were passed unanimously.

University City University Hall Updates – Mayor Terry Crow thanked former chairman Derek Dearer for his time and dedication during his time leading the Loop Special Business District. Mayor Crow spoke about the upcoming developments in the Delmar Loop and around University City.

Deputy City Manager Brooke Smith shared the details regarding the EDRST approval for the Façade Improvement plan and stated that applications will open in early October.

i. Security Updates – Captain Dana Morley expressed appreciation to everyone who supported the National Night Out event with a special thank you to Michael Alter and Fitz's. Captain Morley mentioned that she would be retiring from the police force at the end of November.

Washington University Update – Joanna Schooler provided information about the students returning to Washington University and that the University is promoting students to visit businesses in the Delmar Loop.

Treasurers Report: Dan Wald indicated that he did not have the current report and would share with the group later.

Loop Events / Marketing: Jessica Bueler shared details about the four events approved by the LSBD Board for fiscal year 2025 which include the Holiday Events, the Ice Carnival, The Loop Mural Festival, and Budding Artist Event.

Renau Bozarth provided and overview of the Budding Artist Event and how it will benefit the area while engaging the businesses, and that it was patterned after Cherokee Street Event.

EDRST Projects: Jessica Bueler updated the group on the five EDRST projects that have been carried forward from fiscal year 2024 which include the Expanded Outdoor Dining, Power Washing of Delmar Blvd, New Trash Receptacles, Additional Trash Pickup and Cleaning, and the Repairs for the Walk of Fame Stars. Ms. Bueler stated that the LSBD Board has prioritized the trash repotacles because of the cost and that it will be completed first.

Dan Wald shared an update about a potential Chinese Bakry hoving into the former Melting Pot location.

Jessica Bueler spoke about Dr. Wash Wizard and the forts that are being put forward to maintain and clean the Delmar Loop.

Dan Wald asked if the LSBD could paint the light poles once they are cleaned of the stickers. Mayor Terry Crow indicates that this should be coordinated with Public Works by communicating with the City Manager before moving forward.

Suzanne Schoomer inquired about the planting of new trees in the Delmar Loop and what the role of the LSPD was in the process. Deputy City Manager Brooke Smith informed the gourp that the project was being coordinated with U City in Bloom and they would scheme the EDRST application for this request.

Old Business: Michael Alter asked Joe Edwards who had the holiday lights, so that the LSBD Board could coordinate the install. Joe Edwards stated they were being held at a Washington University location, and Samantha Smugala announced that all the holiday lights are being stored together at this location.

Suzanne Schumer asked what steps were being taken to add new board members to the Loop Special Business District. Dan Wald indicated that Chairman Deaver only recently stepped down and that they will need to recruit some new members.

New Business: There was no new business.

Public Comments: Samantha Smugala shared details about the Discount Days in the Delmar Loop which is aimed on attracting Washington University Students. Ms. Smugala spoke about an upcoming Dia de Muertos event along with a new business Goodcents Subs that is opening in the Loop.
