

Great Rivers Greenway Construction Notice

Great Rivers Greenway, in coordination with Metro, and the Cities of Clayton, Ladue, Olivette and University City, is starting construction of another segment of the Centennial Greenway, a biking and walking trail. Construction crews are mobilizing for the construction of the Centennial Greenway from Shaw Park in Clayton to Olive Blvd in Olivette. The facility will be a great place to exercise or ride your bike to and from work.

Construction Details:

Location: East side of I-170 from Shaw Park to Olive Blvd.

Schedule: Construction begins April 2012 and will be complete Winter 2012

Construction Hours: 7 AM to 5 PM Monday through Friday

Scope:

- Clearing of vegetation and debris
- Grading for the trail
- Construction of a 10-foot-wide concrete pedestrian/bicycle trail
- New pedestrian crosswalks at Delmar & McKnight and Ladue & Hunter
- New landscaping for trail project area

Have you started grilling this season? Safety tips from the Fire Department

According to a FEMA Topical Fire Report Series on "Grill Fires on Residential Properties," statistics from 2006 to 2008 show:

- Grill fires on residential properties result in an estimated average of 10 deaths, 100 injuries, and \$37 million in property loss each year.
- Over half (57%) of grill fires on residential properties occur during May, June, July, and August.
- 32% of grill fires on residential properties start on patios, terraces, screened-in porches, or courtyards, while an additional 24% start on exterior balconies and unenclosed porches.
 - The leading category of equipment power source is "gas fuels" (79%). Within this category, propane is the power source in 69% of all grill fires on residential properties.
- "Heat from powered equipment" is the leading heat source category for grill fires on residential
 - properties (47%). Within this category, spark, ember, or flame from operating equipment

- accounts for 28% of all grill fires on residential properties.
- The leading category of factors contributing to ignition is "mechanical failure, malfunction" (35 percent). Within this category, leaks or breaks of containers or pipes account for 23% of all grill fires on residential properties.

- → Always check and maintain your grill equipment
- → Check gas line and connections for leaks
- Evaluate the area before starting the grill
- Never leave a grill (charcoal or gas) unattended
- Never put hot or smoldering coals in a plastic or metal trash receptacle
- Remember that coals can stay warm for several days after grilling

2012 Olive Boulevard Business Survey Findings

In early 2012, the University City Department of Community Development (Dept. of CD) conducted a business survey of the owners of registered businesses on Olive Boulevard within the City limits of University City. The responses will provide a framework for defining the problems and directing attention to the issues that might impact economic development along the Olive corridor.

All 243 registered businesses along Olive Boulevard in University City were grouped into four geographical districts based generally on the 2009 Olive Boulevard Design Guidelines and the Zoning Code: the Interchange/"Crossroads" District (from I-170 to McKnight Road), the International District (from McKnight Road to Midland Boulevard), the Parkway District (from Midland Boulevard to Ferguson Avenue), and the Industrial District (from Ferguson Avenue to Skinker Boulevard). 27 of those registered businesses are in the Crossroads District, while 132 are in the International District, 50 are in the Parkway District, and 34 are in the Industrial District. The survey asked 15 questions; the last 2 questions were open-ended.

As of March 23rd, 100 survey responses were received, representing a 41% overall response rate. 29% of the respondents described themselves as minority, woman-owned, and/or disadvantaged businesses¹; 22% of the respondents were property owners. Business & Professional Services and Retail Trade Sectors represented the majority of Olive Boulevard business owners who responded to the survey.

Most of the business owners indicated that Olive Boulevard in University City is a beneficial location for them; some of them have been there for decades. They cited easy access to customers and a strong business environment as the reasons that they enjoy operating along Olive Boulevard. Problems with public safety, parking, streetscape (infrastructure), and trash were mentioned frequently in written responses to the open-ended Suggestions for questions. streetscape improvement included lighting, landscaping, street conditions, and signs. In response, the Dept. of CD will collaborate with other City departments and the Olive Boulevard community in addressing the most



pressing issues.

In terms of plans for future expansion of businesses, 36% of the respondents expressed a likelihood of expanding in 2012 with respondents in all four business districts indicating they have expansion plans. Respondents indicated plans for 83 new hires and 22,000 square feet of additional space for 2012. Further, one-third of the respondents are interested in working with the newly re-activated University City Chamber of Commerce and the previously active Olive Business Association (OBA). Part of the Dept. of CD's ongoing effort includes lending support to the new Chamber and re-activating the OBA by working with groups within the four districts to determine the best marketing approach, event planning, and other efforts to improve district businesses.

The survey results support the notion of the International District as a regional tourist destination, meaning imported money is spent in the City by customers from other areas of the region and bi-state area, and contributes to the University City economy. Also, we have learned that Olive Boulevard businesses enjoy being near their customers and their own homes. They are positive about the Olive Boulevard business environment and its high availability of goods and services. A significant number of Olive Boulevard businesses are optimistic about the near future and have plans for expansion.

¹ M/W/DB Enterprises are eligible for state and local contracts and loan programs administered by the Missouri Department of Transportation, Lambert International Airport, and the MO Department of Economic Development. The Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program Office is located at Lambert Airport.

Scholarship Program Available for U City Residents

Everyone should have the opportunity to improve their quality of life through recreation facilities and programs. To help meet this goal, the Department of Community Development – Recreation Division offers a recreation scholarship to income-qualified University City residents. Funding is limited.

The scholarship award amount will be based on all household income sources, including related and unrelated people residing in a household. Individual and family scholarships are available. Scholarships are provided at a sliding scale, dependent on income, at a discounted rate of 25%, 50%, or 75% of the program's adopted fee.

Scholarships are available for the following:

- Youth before and after school programs, and city operated full day recreation programs (i.e. Summer Youth Recreation Program, etc.)
- Fitness and/or Leisure education classes.
 Lessons and senior social activities will be limited to two (2) per person per fiscal quarter (July 1-Sept 30, Oct 1-Dec 31, Jan 1-Mar 31, Apr 1-June 30)
- Centennial Commons memberships and Heman Pool/Natatorium Swim Passes
- University City Sports Association or University City Soccer Club youth sports player fees






